


- The percentage of family court filings, in comparison with civil, criminal, and probate, was at the highest from FY 2000-01 through FY 2003-04. During that period, family court filings were approximately 44% of all circuit court filings.
- Beginning in FY 2004-05, the percentage of family court filings, compared to all circuit court filings, began to drop. This pattern continued and the percentage reached the lowest point in FY 2008-09.
- The percentage of family court filings has risen since FY 2008-09 and is now 38.5% of all circuit court filings.
- For the above referenced time period, family court filings have been the largest percentage of circuit court filings (compared to civil, criminal, and probate) during 13 of the 17 years.



- Simplified dissolution filings are significantly up with a steady upward trend through 2015-16.
- Dissolution filings have been up and down, with minimal change.
- Child support filings are up and down, with the exception of the past three years when they have been steady.
- Domestic violence filings are up and down with minimal change.
- Delinquency filings are significantly down with a steady downward trend.
- Dependency filings show an upward trend during the past four years.
