ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The purpose of the Florida Courts Technology Commission is to oversee, manage, and direct the development and use of technology within the judicial branch under the direction of the Florida Supreme Court, as specified in Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.236.




