IN RE: FLORIDA COURTS TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Florida Courts Technology Commission

On September 8, 1995, in accordance with the Supreme Court's responsibility of adopting policy and plans for the use of information technology resources in Florida's courts, the Chief Justice formally established the Court Technology User's Committee for a term of service to expire on July 31, 1997. In 1997, the Court extended the existence of the Committee for an additional term of service and designated the Committee as the FLORIDA COURTS TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION (FCTC). The Commission has consistently been extended every second year thereafter. By this order, the existence of the Commission is hereby extended for an additional term of service to expire on July 31, 2003. The charge of the Commission will be as follows, except as otherwise directed by this Court.

1. Recommend policy governing the use of technology resources in the state courts system.

2. Set priorities for appellate and trial court technology budgets and present recommendations to the Appellate Court Budget Commission and the Trial Court Budget Commission.
3. Review and recommend to the Supreme Court approval of technical and functional standards developed by both the Appellate Technology Committee and the Trial Court Technology Committee. Assure that the technology supporting the state courts system is capable of integrating with both the appellate and trial courts.
4. Approve technology plans developed by the Trial Court Technology Committee and Appellate Technology Committee.

Committees of the Commission

In conjunction with the Commission, this Court has also formally established four committees: (1) the Appellate Technology Committee, established by order dated October 15, 1996; (2) the Electronic Filing Committee, established by order dated November 27, 1996; (3) the Year 2000 Committee, established by order dated June 29, 1998; and (4) the Trial Courts Technology Committee, formalized by order dated July 24, 1997. By this order, three of the four committees are hereby extended for an additional term of service to expire on July 31, 2003. The Year 2000 Committee has been abolished with the completion of the mandated technology required for Year 2000. Therefore, there are now three standing committees. The duties of those committees shall be as set forth in the administrative orders establishing those committees, except as otherwise directed by the order of this Court. The chairs of each of these committees shall be members of the Commission; the

members of the committees may be appointed to the Commission, but need not be a member of the Commission to serve on the committee.




Staff support for the Commission and committees will be provided by the Office of the State Courts Administrator.
