IN RE: FLORIDA COURTS
TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

In September of 1995, the Chief Justice formally established a committee with responsibilities of adopting policy and plans for information technology. The Florida Courts Technology Commission was extended for additional service to expire on July 31, 2003, and charged as follows, except as otherwise directed by this Court.

1. Recommend policy governing the use of technology resources in the state courts system.
2. Set priorities for appellate and trial court technology budgets and present recommendations to the Appellate Court Budget Commission and the Trial Court Budget Commission.
3. Review and recommend to the Supreme Court approval of technical and functional standards developed by both the Appellate Technology Committee and the Trial Court Technology Committee, and assure that the technology supporting the state courts system is capable of

integrating with both the appellate and trial courts.

4. Approve technology plans developed by the Trial Court Technology Committee and Appellate Technology Committee.

The Court understands the role of the clerk of court as the designated official keeper of the courts' records. By this order, the Court appoints as a member of the commission the current President of the Florida Association of Court Clerks (FACC).



The current President of the FACC may appoint another clerk of court as his designee.

This appointment to the commission will extend to future Presidents of the FACC until the FCTC term expires on July 31, 2003, or the commission is disbanded.


Staff support for the Commission and committees will be provided by the Office of the State Courts Administrator.
