## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

### *Florida Courts Technology Commission*

On September 8, 1995, in accordance with the Supreme Court's responsibility of adopting policy and plans for the use of information technology resources in Florida's courts, the Chief Justice formally established the Court Technology User's Committee for a term of service to expire on July 31, 1997. On July 24, 1997, the Court extended the existence of the Committee for an additional term of service to expire on July 31, 1999, and designated the Committee as the FLORIDA COURTS TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION (FCTC). By this order, the existence of the Commission is hereby extended for an additional term of service to expire on July 31, 2001. The duties and responsibilities of the Commission shall continue as directed in the September 8, 1995, administrative order, except as otherwise directed by this Court.

### *Subcommittees of the Commission*

In conjunction with the Commission, this Court has also formally established four subcommittees: (1) the Appellate Technology Subcommittee, established by order dated October 15, 1996; (2) the Electronic Filing Subcommittee, established by order dated November 27, 1996; (3) the Year 2000 Subcommittee, established by order dated June 29, 1998; and (4) the Trial Courts Technology Subcommittee, formalized by order dated July 24, 1997. 
